I was that seventh grader. My name is Jamil McClintock - I am a father, husband, son, brother, friend and a proud SEEDS Alum and donor. I am excited to share my SEEDS story with you. In charting my journey from Scholar to Alum, I am sure you will agree that SEEDS' positive impact is undeniable.

I first heard about SEEDS through my middle school English teacher. Mrs. Lucky handed me an application and shared how SEEDS would give me the opportunity to attend more challenging school and engage with like-minded students.

My response was clear – why not? I applied, got into the program and in the following months worked extremely hard to ensure I remained a SEEDS scholar following the demanding four-week summer program. It was not easy. My middle school was not terribly rigorous, and I was used to being a top achiever, but upon being surrounded by other highly motivated students and faced with a challenging SEEDS curriculum and instructors, I developed better academic skills which prepared me for the challenge of enrolling at an independent school.

As it happened, The Pingry School, which was my SEEDS summer site, was the school I chose to enroll at for high school. Pingry was unlike any other school I had ever seen. Through my thirteen-year-old eyes, its grandness and open spaces inspired me to challenge myself academically to make attending such a school a real possibility.

With mentors among the SEEDS Board of Trustees, staff, partners, and donors, I successfully navigated Brown University, where I majored in Economics and graduated with the highest honors from Golden Gate University School of Law, before embarking on a career as a corporate attorney. I am currently a Principal and Associate General Counsel at Deloitte.
